FOR THE CBSA SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

The CBSA Scholarship Committee is looking for additional volunteers to serve on the committee.

Members wishing to serve on the Scholarship Committee should have a strong passion for the red metals industry and be willing to engage other members in scholarship fundraising activities. Reviewing the scholarship applicants requires a great attention to detail and a large time commitment approximately four weeks prior to the CBSA Convention.

The Scholarship Committee suggests new or revised policy guidelines, reviews applications, selects recipients and develops fundraising programs. It reports to the CBSA Board of Directors.

SPECIFIC DUTIES

Duties and responsibilities of the Scholarship Committee include:

- Review all scholarship applications received by the CBSA Charitable Foundation
- Recommend qualified candidates to receive scholarships
- Advise the Board of Directors in establishing and modifying scholarship criteria and other elements of the program
- Assist in foundation fundraising efforts

Time Commitment

- Approximately 30 hours dedicated to reviewing scholarship applications starting one month prior to the Annual Convention
- Annual face-to-face meeting at the CBSA Convention to finalize recommendations to the Board of Directors
- Additional meetings via conference call as necessary

Term of Office

- Members of the committee serve staggered four-year terms

Application Deadline

Applications to serve on the Scholarship Committee are due by August 31, 2021.
